1. All **Exhibitors must pay admission on Entry to Show** – Admission Tickets are available in advance from the Secretary,
2. All Ewes to have reared a lamb this season.
3. The Exhibitors of all sheep must either own the sheep or have full authority from the owner. Breed Champion going forward to the Overhead must be under supervision of the Exhibitor.
4. All articles in the Vegetable and Flower Classes to be grown by and be the *bona fide* property of the Exhibitor.
5. All articles that have been previously exhibited in the Industrial Section are debarred. All exhibits to be staged by 10.15am prompt.
6. The Industrial marquee will close before cup presentation and re open after cup presentation. All exhibits unclaimed will become the property of the committee, unless the Secretary has received instructions from the Exhibitor.
7. In the Horticultural and Industrial Sections, the catalogue number of the exhibit is placed on the table in duplicate. One number must be attached to the exhibit beside the corresponding number. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to see that their exhibits are correctly staged and the correct duplicate number affixed to their exhibit.
8. The decision of the Committee shall be final in questions respecting premiums, and all other matters connected with the Show.
9. Dogs and children's classes may only be entered on the day.
10. Crooks and walking sticks must be the work of the exhibitor. Novice stick dressers must not have shown for more than three years.

Sticky Orange Marmalade Cake

1 x 20cm or 8inch Round Cake tin, greased & base lined with baking paper

175g Unsalted Butter, softened
175g Caster Sugar
3 Large Eggs
175g Self-raising Flour
½ teaspoon Baking Powder
3 tablespoons Chunky Orange Marmalade
2 tablespoons Full Fat or Semi Skimmed Milk
Pinch of Salt

Topping

3 tablespoons Chunky Orange Marmalade
100g Icing Sugar
2 tablespoons warm water

Preheat oven to 180 C or 350 F (Gas 4)

Put softened butter into a mixing bowl & gradually beat in the sugar.

Add the eggs 1 at a time with a little bit of flour.

Sift the remaining flour, baking powder & salt into the mixture & gently fold in with a metal spoon. When well mixed, add the marmalade & milk & stir in.

Spoon the mixture into the tin & bake for 50 – 55 minutes until golden brown & firm.

Run a round bladed knife around the edge of the tin & turn out onto a wire rack.

Gently warm the rest of the marmalade & brush over the warm cake. Leave to cool.

Mix the icing sugar with the warm water & spoon over the cake letting it run down over the sides. Leave to set.

Tension: 28 sts and 36 rows to 10cm (4in) over stocking stitch on 3.25mm needles

BACK

Using 2.75mm needles cast on 49[57:65] sts.

1st Row. K1,* p1, k1, rep from * to end.

2nd Row. * P1, K1, rep from * to last st, p1.

These 2 rows will now be referred to as 1x1 rib.

Work in 1x1 rib for 3[3:4]cm, (1 ¼ [1 ¼: 1 ½]in), ending with a ws row.

Change to 3.25mm needles and proceed as follows:-

1st Row. Knit.

2nd Row. Purl.

These 2 rows will now be referred to as st-st (stocking stitch).

Working in st-st throughout cont until back measures 10[12:14]cm, (4[4 ¾: 5 ½]in), ending with a ws row.

Shape Raglan

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 43[51:59] sts.

All sizes

1st Row. K1,s1, k1, pssso, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 41[49:57] sts.

2nd Row. Purl.

3rd Row. Knit.

4th Row. Purl.

Rep from 1st to 4th rows

4[3:2] times more.

33[43:53] sts.

All sizes

1st Row. K1, s1, k1, pssso, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

31[41:51]sts.

2nd Row. Purl.

1st and 2nd rows set raglan shapings.

Work 8[16:24] rows dec 1 st at each end as before in next and every foll alt row.

23[25:27] sts. Cast off remaining 23[25:27] sts.

LEFT FRONT

Using 2.75mm needles cast on 22[26:30] sts.

1st Row. * K1, p1, rep from * to end.

Rep 1st row for 3[3:4] cm, (1 ¼[1 ¼: 1 ½]in), ending with a rs row.

Next Row. Rib to end inc 1 st in centre of row.

23[27:31] sts.

Change to 3.25mm needles and working in st-st throughout cont until left front measures

10[12:14]cm, (4[4 ¾: 5 ½]in), ending with a ws row.

Shape Raglan

Next Row. Cast off 3 sts, knit to end. 20[24:28] sts.

Next Row. Purl.

All sizes

1st Row. K1, s1, k1, pssso, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog.

2nd Row. Purl.

3rd Row. Knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, 17[21:25] sts.

4th Row. Purl.

Rep 1st and 2nd rows once more. 15[19:23] sts.

Work 14[10:10] rows dec 1 st at raglan edge as before in 3rd and every foll 4th row AT SAME TIME dec 1 st at neck edge in 3rd and every foll 4th row. 9[15:19] sts.

All sizes

Work 5[13:17] rows dec 1 st at raglan edge as before in next and every foll alt row AT SAME TIME dec 1 st at neck edge in next and every foll 4th row. 4[4:5] sts.

Work 3 rows dec 1 st at raglan edge only in 2nd row. 3[3:4] sts.

For 1st and 2nd sizes only

Next Row. K1, s1, k1, pssso. 2sts.

Next Row. P2tog. Fasten off.

For 3rd size only

Next Row. K1, s1, k2tog, pssso. 2sts.

Next Row. P2tog. Fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT

Using 2.75mm needles cast on 22[26:30] sts.

1st Row. * P1, k1, rep from * to end.

Rep 1st row for 3[3:4] cm, (1 ¼[1 ¼: 1 ½]in), ending with a rs row.

Next Row. Rib to end inc 1 st in centre of row.

23[27:31] sts.

Change to 3.25mm needles and working in st-st throughout cont until left front measures

10[12:14]cm, (4[4 ¾: 5 ½]in), ending with a rs row.

Shape Raglan

Next Row. Cast off 3 sts, purl to end. 20[24:28] sts.

All sizes

1st Row. K2tog, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

2nd Row. Purl.

3rd Row. K2tog, knit to end. 17[21:25] sts.

4th Row. Purl.

Rep 1st and 2nd rows once more 15[19:23] sts.

Work 14[10:10] rows dec 1 st at raglan edge as before in 3rd and every foll 4th row AT SAME TIME dec 1 st at neck edge in 3rd and every foll 4th row. 9[15:19]sts.

All sizes

Work 5[13:17] rows dec 1 st at neck edge in next and every foll 4th row AT SAME TIME dec 1 st at raglan edge as before in next and every foll alt row. 4[4:5] sts. Work 3 rows dec 1 st at raglan edge only in 2nd row. 3[3:4] sts.

For 1st and 2nd sizes only

Next Row. K2tog, k1. 2sts.

Next Row. P2tog. Fasten off.

For 3rd size only

Next Row. K3tog, k1.

Next Row. P2tog. Fasten off.

SLEEVES (Both alike)

Using 2.75mm needles cast on 29[31:33]sts, work in 1x1 rib for 3[3:4]cm, (1 ¼[1 ½: 1 ½]in), ending with a ws row.

Change to 3.25mm needles and working in st-st throughout inc 1 st at each end of 3rd and every foll 5th[5th:4th] row to 41[45:49] sts. Cont without shaping

until sleeve measures 13[14:15]] cm, (5 ¼ [5 ½:6] in), or length required ending with a ws row.

Shape Raglan

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 35[39:43] sts.

1st Row. K1, s1, k1, pssso, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

2nd Row. Purl.

Rep 1st and 2nd rows

14[16:18] times more. 5 sts.

Cast off rem 5 sts.

BUTTON BORDER

Join raglan seams. Using 2.75mm needles cast on 7 sts and proceed as follows:-
1st Row. Knit.

This row will now be referred to as g-st (garter stitch).

Working in g-st throughout cont until border is of sufficient length (when slightly stretched) to go up front edge, across sleeve top and halfway across back, ending with a rs row. Cast off. Sew border in position. Place markers for 4 buttons, the first 1cm, (1/2 in) from cast on edge and the last 1cm, (1/2 in) below first front dec. Space rem 2 buttons evenly between.

BUTTONHOLE BORDER

Work to match Button Border making buttonholes to match markers on rs rows as follows:-
Buttonhole Row. K3, yfwd, k2tog, k2.
Sew border in position, joining at back of neck.

TO MAKE UP

Join side and sleeve seams. Sew on buttons. Pin out garment to the measurement

given at the top of the pattern. Cover with damp cloths and leave until dry. See ball band for washing and further care instructions.
